RISE—Research on Improving Systems of Education—is a new multi-country program that aims to build understanding of education systems and how they can transform to significantly improve learning. RISE is funded by the United Kingdom's Department for International Development, which has allocated £21 million for high-quality research in up to five countries over six years. RISE will solicit proposals from consortia interested in producing high-quality research on how education systems can be transformed to address the current learning crisis in developing countries. The ultimate goal of RISE is to accelerate progress in student learning globally. The countries preferred for RISE research are Ethiopia, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Nigeria, Pakistan, and Vietnam, though proposals from countries outside of this list are also welcome.

RISE plans to issue a request for Expressions of Interest (EoI) on July 1, with EoIs due August 23, 2015. Eligible bidders will be invited by mid-September to submit a response to the full request for proposals by mid-November 2015.

RISE staff will lead a presentation and question-and-answer session for potential bidders on the project's Terms of Reference. The meeting is open to all interested, and will be <u>webstreamed</u>.
